

CBJ Neighborhood history

Some of us remember the CBJ neighborhood before the massive redevelopment of the '60s. Others may be curious about how things used to be.

I have collected a number of photos that show the area near the old "Old Colony Theater," now the landmark building, Sandwich Street, Market Street, and Summer Street.
