PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear CBJ friends,

This is certainly turning out to be one snowy winter, and I hope that all of you are managing to stay safe and warm. I for one am looking forward to Spring!

As you will read in Rabbi Silverman's message, we look forward to the holiday of Purim coming up in March. The commandments of Purim are to eat, drink and be merry, but this is also accompanied by the mitzvah of giving "matanot l'evyonim" (gifts to the poor) and "tzedakah" (charity). In the Book of Esther we read, "The same days on which Jews enjoyed relief from their foes and the same month which had been transformed for them from one of grief to joy and from mourning to festival, they were to observe them as days of feasting and merry-making, and as an occasion for sending gifts [mishloach manot] and presents to the poor [matanot l'evyonim]" (Esther 9:22). So as you celebrate Purim this year, I encourage you to think of ways to give gifts to those less fortunate. Bring in some extra food items to donate to the Greater Plymouth Food Warehouse, or volunteer to help at the Warehouse. Support our "Nights of Hospitality for the Homeless" in March (see details on page 5). Remember that performing mitzvot brings rewards not only to the lives of those to whom we are giving, but it also brings rewards to our own lives through a sense of blessing, of healing and of connection.

FROM RABBI SILVERMAN:


With the Feast of Purim just around the corner (March 16), I thought it would be appropriate to focus on some of the power of this so-called "minor" holiday. My focus begins with a look at the "Purimspiel."

A "Purimspiel" (Yiddish for "Purim Play") is a traditional dramatization based on the Book of Esther and performed on or about the time of the Feast of Esther, that is, Purim. The Purimspiel appears to have started 250 to 300 years ago in Eastern Europe. It generally satirizes the characters in the Purim story: King Achashvayrosh, Vashti, Haman, Mordechai, Esther, et al. Ordinarily such satire would have been deemed inappropriate for the synagogue -- except on Purim!

The Purimspiel and the holiday of Purim itself became so much enjoyed and loved by the Jewish people that Purimspiel-type performances spread to other Biblical stories as well, such as "Joseph and His Brothers" and "Daniel in the Lions' Den." When times were tough, as they often were, nothing was as soothing and uplifting as a story with a happy ending about the Jewish people's ancient heroes. Usually the Purimspiel used non-professional people as actors. One favorite form, especially for children, involved the use of puppets.

The foregoing background brings us to an amazing discovery that took place only a few years ago: a manuscript of a Purimspiel, composed by Walter Freud (no relation to Sigmund) and written in the prison camp of by the Nazis, in the spring of 1942, to Terezin. He immediately began staging puppet shows for the children. He directed performances for the Jewish holidays. In 1943, the Zionist Youth organization in Terezin celebrated Purim using Freud's original Purimspiel. (The play whose manuscript was discovered recently.) In good traditional fashion, even in such a place, his text was a comic one. His script combined freely the Biblical characters with scenes that gave insight into the prisoners' lives. The Purimspiel included: a cabaret song about gossip in the camp; scenes about the young Zionists' love of labor and their dedication to the land of Israel; vignettes showing their struggles to learn to speak modern Hebrew; and moments of great tension and fear turning into triumphal relief. In the finale, Esther, Mordechai, the King, and Haman (still around) all sang a comic refrain based on a German folk-song.

Can we imagine it? There is great spirit and power in the make-believe of this so-called "minor" holiday of Purim. All honor to Walter Freud, of blessed memory -- and to those who remember the Jewish people's history, as we celebrate Esther's feast.



LIMUD TORAH / TORAH STUDY GROUP

Our Limud Torah / Torah Study Group generally meets every Monday morning, from 8:30 to 10:00 a. m., at the Synagogue. As a group, we decide upon a traditional or modern piece of Jewish literature, which then becomes our subject for a month or for half a year, depending upon the scope of the work we are considering. We now look forward to continuing our study of our new subject, the Book of Ecclesiastes. Under the direction of Rabbi Silverman. No Hebrew required (though always helpful). <u>Jewish Calendar Unit</u> - The children enjoyed a creative unit focusing on our lunar calendar. Classes compared our everyday calendar with the Jewish calendar and discovered their dates of birth according to the Jewish calendar. Each student received a certificate with that date and the name of Torah portion that is read on their date of birth. Another fun and tasty activity involved showing the phases of the moon using Oreo cookies!

<u>Literature Unit</u> - Students explored more Jewish literature focusing on topics such as holidays, culture & traditions, Ellis Island, and the Holocaust. Activities involved comparing stories, creating a classroom quilt, decorating spice boxes, and story writing.

Shabbat Attendance - Remember that children are expected to attend <u>4 Shabbat services</u> during the school year. If they can't make it to our Simcha Shabbat, they can get credit for attending another Shabbat service. Consider reaching out to other parents to see if they can help with transportation.



Notes on Yahrzeit observance:

Some customs associated with Yahrzeit observance are: lighting a memorial candle at home in the evening at the beginning of the Yahrzeit period; saying Kaddish during a Shabbat service close to the Yahrzeit; donating to a charity or one of CBJ's special funds in memory of the one whose Yahrzeit is being observed.

Members, Guests and Friends of CBJ:

I am happy to remind you of a program that we offer at Congregation Beth Jacob to inform fellow Jews: both members and their families and friends of CBJ, of the annual yahrzeit dates of their loved ones. Once you have supplied the names and dates (either Hebrew or English) of those whom you wish to remember, you will receive notification approximately three weeks in advance of the yahrzeit date. There is no charge for this service. We feel that it's important to supply this service to all interested Jews.

I realize that our members have furnished this information when they joined CBJ. We ask those of you who have not done so to supply this information again so we can be sure our records are up-to-date and accurate. This program is separate from your listings in our annual Yizkor Book of Remembrance.




